Greetings from the Lowcountry Phi Beta Kappa Association! We would like to share some big news with you. The College of Charleston now has a PBK chapter approved by the national PBK Society. Meanwhile, LPBK is happily planning our 2024-25 program season. In a few weeks, you will receive notice of our first event, part of the National Office "Key Connections" initiative. We will gather on October 14th at Gage Hall on Archdale Street for happy hour (pizza and one drink per person) before heading to Old City Jail for a "Ghost Tour" conducted on the first floor. In addition, we also plan to host our traditional holiday party, our regular winter meeting with a speaker, and a scholarship dinner in the spring. As always, you are welcome to bring guests to any of our functions.

At the heart of Phi Beta Kappa is promoting the traditional liberal arts and sciences, and our association does this in part through our scholarship program. This past year, we presented a \$2,500 scholarship to 3 rising seniors at the Citadel, the College of Charleston, and Charleston Southern University, and 1 graduating senior at the American College of the Building Arts. 
